

GETTING OUR VOICES HEARD

UK Constituencies Abroad

To change UK law so that all citizens of the UK living abroad can:

- vote for their representation in discrete constituencies abroad
- participate in UK referenda.

Everything changed when the UK left the EU

- When the UK left the EU on 31 January 2020 UK citizens who have lived, live and will live in Europe for more than 15 years were and will be completely *disenfranchised*, This is true for UK citizens elsewhere in the world after 15 years.
- Prior to 31 January 2020, LibDems in France supported the abolition of the 15 year cap on UK voting rights to ensure some measure of democratic equality for all. It leveraged the Government's manifesto pledge to abolish the 15 year rule, as yet unfulfilled!
- Now the British diaspora in Europe joins the diaspora in the rest of the world and is completely disenfranchised.
- The UK has *abandoned* the Human Rights of its citizens living abroad.
- UN Declaration of Human Rights Article 21 Paragraph 1 states that:

Everyone has the right to take part in the government of his country, directly or through freely chosen representatives

- Restoring representation with the right to vote, without which we can have no voice, is our aim

- The last attempt to retain votes for life was shamefully filibustered at the last fence, the 3rd reading in the House of Commons
